

The Commonwealth Blue Charter is an agreement by all Commonwealth countries to collectively tackle oceanrelated challenges. To deliver on its own commitment to the Blue Charter, the ACU established the Blue Charter Fellowships programme with funding from UK BEIS and Waitrose & Partners. Since 2018, the programme supported 48 outstanding researchers from 14 Commonwealth countries to undertake diverse, collaborative research projects on a range of topics related to marine plastics pollution, from consumer behavioural change to community-based recycling strategies. They have not only produced insightful research outcomes, but their commitment to driving change has also generated greater momentum to tackle one of the biggest environmental challenges of our time.

To support Fellows in communicating their research outcomes and engaging key policy, industry, and community actors, Waitrose & Partners have also funded a series of 9 online training modules on knowledge exchange, research uptake, and research impact launched in 2020. All Fellows who completed the training were also eligible to apply for a Knowledge Exchange Grant Scheme, designed to help them plan and deliver impactful community-based activities to tackle plastic pollution and raise ocean awareness across the Commonwealth.
